The James Frizelle Charitable Foundation (JFCF) was established in 2019 to support those who have contributed to our great country but may have unfortunately through no fault of their own, fallen on hard times and can no longer speak for themselves. Inevitably they may not have Government support and are not considered popular or newsworthy charitable projects. They remain the "forgotten" in our society. We wish to assist them to get their life back on track and restore their dignity. We can do this by working with other eligible charities who have the necessary expertise and human resources but need our financial support.

The James Frizelle Charitable Foundation Small Grants program is only available to NOT-FOR-PROFIT (NFP) organisations. We recognise that some NFP groups will be unable to qualify for direct funding from us as they are not a DGR1 Charity. In this instance, we will permit the NFP to enter into an agreement with another qualified organisation which has DGR1 status to complete the project. The group requiring support is known as the "auspicee" or "delivery organisation" and the group holding any grant monies on behalf of auspicee/delivery organisation is known as the "auspisor" or "legal organisation" which has DGR1 status.

Program Information

This 2023 Small Grants Program will offer the following stream of funding:

- JFCF contribution under this program ranges between \$500.00 min to \$5,000.00 max per organisation for a range of grassroots, community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit the local communities located within the Qld/NSW LGA's of the Gold Coast, Tweed Heads, Byron Bay & Lismore and align with one or more of the following priority areas:- Community Health, Disadvantaged, Domestic Violence, Homelessness, Housing & Accommodation and Mental Health;
- For stand-alone projects only, with Total Program Cost < \$10,000.00 benefiting the local communities detailed above;
- Program must be completed within 12 months;

A broad range of charitable projects will be considered under this program, including:

- Delivering, or providing activities, events, programs and services;
- Community infrastructure projects;
- Improving community health and social wellbeing;
- Enabling people to develop skills, knowledge and confidence to lead and contribute to the prosperity of their community;
- Purchasing or hiring equipment and materials;
- Building a sustainable volunteer base and/or supporting the wellbeing of volunteers;
- Enhancing places where communities gather;
- Reducing the divide on access/connectivity/knowledge to digital technology for seniors;
- Community resource development;

What can be funded

JFCF Small Grants are not available to fund:

- Core operating costs (e.g. rent, utilities, regular wages, loan repayments, insurance, fuel, admin costs etc.) of delivery organisations or areas of responsibility of Federal, State and Local Governments;
- Duplication of existing program/services within the delivery organisation, Retrospective/Deficit funding;
- For-profit organisations; Individuals; Government entities; Political lobbying; Research;
- General fundraising appeals;
- Overseas travel and overseas projects;
- Prizes, gifts, trophies or awards;
- Projects that do not meet the identified goals and priorities of the JFCF;
- Projects that primarily benefit private business, a sole trader, or private individuals;
- Projects that require recurrent funding;

What can't be funded



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An organisation will be considered ineligible if:

- Delivery Organisation currently has an existing grant with JFCF;
- Delivery Organisation has more than one application submitted within the Small Grants program;
- Application is submitted by individuals, sole traders, private or commercial businesses (as per the submitted ABN);
- Application is submitted by a delivery organisation that is not a legal entity (does not have DGR1 status), without the written consent of the auspisor/legal organisation which has DGR1 status;
- Application is submitted without required financial documentation;
- Final report/s from any JFCF grants awarded in the previous years have not been acquitted (delivery organisations should check with legal organisation to see if there are any outstanding final reports);
- Application is for a project or activity that has already occurred / is occurring prior to the announcement of funding;
- Application is incomplete. NOTE: Due to the volume of applications received, applications are assessed based on the documentation received at the time of application. JFCF is unlikely to follow up missing documentation after applications have been submitted.
